#### **MANDATED RACIAL PROFILING REPORTING TO INCLUDE “JURISDICTION”**

The change that has been proposed by administrative rule change that will go into effect addresses a new section 6 which asks whether the individual that has been stopped is a resident of your agency’s jurisdiction. It appears that at this time the assessment of jurisdiction would rely on the address on the driver’s license. When more information is available MPCA will provide it to our membership. (Attached are the proposed administrative change and a copy of the “NEW” Vehicle Stop Information Form). This may have an effect with your RSM System’s manner of capturing data for your annual report.

#### **HOMELAND SECURITY:**

This is just an FYI. FEMA is asking states near TX about sheltering some of the people displaced by the storm. As of right now there are no plans to move anyone out of TX, however they think there is a possibility of it happening so they are beginning to plan for it. If it does MO would end up having to shelter around 10K evacuees maximum. We already advised them that if they do fly some up here not to use the STL airport, at least for the time being. The primary locations for the shelters would be in Region’s A,F and D. Secondary locations would be in E,I,G and possibly C as a last resort. I currently do not have any specific locations in each Region because a lot of that depends on what the Red Cross has available. If and when more information becomes available I will push it out to MPCA. Also, for any of MPCA members that use WebEoc there is a new event loaded into it for Harvey that they can log on and see all the information that is listed there. Law enforcement agencies notify the Department of Social Services as soon as possible after a first encounter with a person who reasonably appears to be a victim of trafficking, in order for the Department to determine whether the person may be eligible for state or federal services, programs, or assistance. The Department may use the information provided in order to coordinate with relevant state, federal, and local agencies to evaluate appropriate services for victims of trafficking.
